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## INTRODUCTION

While Prediction I and II described new developments and the practical use of the basic findings made by Cyril Fagan, A.P. Ne/son Page and Vende/ Polich, Prediction III is based solely on my own research in the Transit and Prenatal Transit System which was discussed in Prediction 1 .

A great help in this respect had been the large number of rectified Radices, sixteen of which had been used for the most efficient Primary Directional method (the Topocentric System) and the workings of fixed stars demonstrated in this book. Some of my aims in astrology are, and have always been, to develop astrological techniques which secure both
a) a scientifically correct birth time, and
b) a comprehensive way to practise prediction.

The main problem for most astrologers is still the authentication of the true birth time, not only as to the trustworthiness of a time of birth, but also by means of astrological systems that allow certainty against chance to be controlled with a high probability factor of success.
It has been found in practice that in cases where several birth times are in question for the same nativity, radical delineations of these different horoscopes are not adequate to select the true birth time.
(See John Lennon, Prediction //)
Whilst the most appropriate rectification method so far, giving scientifically acceptable results within one minute of arc, has been demonstrated with Primary Directions (Prediction //), there are a number of other astrological systems which permit the verification of a birth time in a most simple way. (Secondary Progressions and Regressions derlved from Sidereal Solar Returns in Prediction /; the Ascendant-Lunar Chart demonstrated in this book).
Besides this, the two last-mentioned rectification methods, if used alone, secure a well-authenticated, approximate birth time with enough accuracy to guarantee a satisfactory handling of analyses and predictions in all the recommended methods of Prediction /
All these astrological systems are closing the ring for the mutual confirmation of a sclentifically correct birth time. The aim of every astroioger should be a perfectly authenticated birth time for his own nativity as demonstrated in the Radices of Edward Kennedy and Juan Peron, and a well- authenticated Conception-Horoscope (Prenatal Epoch).

## Synastry


#### Abstract

It has always been a very difficult task to find an answer to the main questions in Synastry: What the relationship between two or more people will be like, whether their psychological and emotional characteristics fit together, and if their relationship will be durable or not.

The most primitive form of chart comparisons is the judgement of Sun-Sign compatibility. Users'of this method maintain that, for instance, a man with Sun in Aries could not have a harmonious and long-lasting relatlonship with a woman who has the Sun in Cancer or Capricorn as the Sun of the man squares the woman's Sun.

Instead, this method mainly recommends partnership between Sun-Signs which are either in opposition or harmonious aspect to each other. Therefore a person with Sun in Aries is sald to fit best with other persons who have the Sun in the following Slgns: Gemini, Aquarjus (sextile); Leo, Saglttarius (trine) and Libra (opposition).

This example could be applied in the same way for all the twelve Signs of the Zodiac. However, this way of classifying partnership not only tums out to be insignificant but is also refuted by the statistical analysis of about 250 cases which revealed that there are more long-lasting partnerships and frlendships where the Suns of the two individuals are in square to each other than one would ever expect.

It is easy to understand that Sun-Sign comparisons have to be rejected for many other reasons, too.

Before golng into detalls it is aiways essential to analyze the horoscopes of partners separately. There are people who are more or less predestinated for partnership while others are not. In extreme cases there are horoscopes that have no tendencles for a long-lasting relationship at all.

People of this kind have no friends, and they may also remain single for their whole life and not have much contact with the opposite sex. Horoscopes with characteristic Capricorn-tendencies, especially with a Saturn affliction to Venus (for males) or to Mars (for females) have very little receptlvity for the opposite sex, whether because of extreme shyness or because they are not capable of true love. Sometimes, also, the ctrcumstances in their early Ilfe play an important role.


The best way for gaining experience in astrological techniques is the analysis of the astrologer's own Chart, as he should be well informed of the circumstances of the events analysed, and consequently will be able, with growing experience, to bulld up a good judgement of planetary symbolism. On the other hand with this he is also getting experience in how to interpret Radix Horoscopes, a branch of astrology which unfortunately is often handled with little care, although, there is no doubt, it needs years of experience before true results can be achieved.

In order to help young astrologers in choosing the right astrological tools without spending a lifetime with fictional astrological methods, and also to save the precious time of the more talented students who have a good proportional feeling - time which they have to spend before they find a successful way to learn and practise astrology - I have made a review of the most popular, more or less fictional astrological methods. in most cases these have ilttle or no astronomical background, but a superfluous number of factors which cannot be controlled.
(See 'Fictions in Astrology' below).
I wish to thank Marguerite and Dy mock Brose (Blackheath, Australia) who made the publication of this book possible through their kind assistance.

Planets on the MC, usually the dominating Cusp in a horoscope, and therefore in a mundane square to the Ascendant, may increase impulses of ambition and sometimes the trend to extreme power if simultaneously squared by other planets.

ADOLF HITLER's Horoscope (Prediction $/ /, \mathrm{No} .13$ ) is a characteristic example of this. Saturn in the loth House is here squared by Venus conjunct Mars. Hitler's relationship to other people and also to the opposite sex was decisively crippled by these aspects. So far, a few examples have been given to demonstrate that, prior to the analysis of partnership, the characteristics of the Radix have to be carefully considered.

In cases where the horoscope has a dominant Moon, men, especially, may be prevented from making or strengthening contacts with the opposite sex because of their psychological and emotional dependence on their mothers. With females, bad experiences, especially in sexual contacts (in extreme cases, rape), or disappointments conceming true love and affection are matters that considerably reduce the readiness for contacts. Needless to say, horoscopes of such complicated people need much care before an actual partnership analysis can start.

## RADIX CHARACIERISTICS Pro and Contra Partnershio with the monosite sex:

SUN and MOON in conjunctions, oppositions, trines and sextiles support the capablifty for partnership, if they are not serlously afflicted by (mainly) Satum and Uramus in squares, or semisquares and sesquiquadrates. The affliction may always be regarded as powerful if the aspecting planet (Mars, Saturn, Neptune, Pluto) has a dominant position in the birth chart. This applies for all cases where favourable planetary combinations are afflicted by dominant malefics. Planets which are either in conjunction with or in square to an Angle, or high in the sky (in the 9th or 10th House), elevated over the other planets concerned, have to be regarded as dominant.

The best Sun/Moon combination for partnership in a birth chart is the opposition, preferably on Angles. Conjunctions are very helpful too, especially if on the Ascendant or the Descendant.
As we all know, the Ascendant plays the main role in the horoscope of an individual conceming his character, emotions and reactions. Therefore close aspects to the Ascendant, and consequently also to the Descendant, are of main importance when considering the readiness for partnership.
Aspects of tension to the Ascendant - Descendant axis of (mainly ) Mars, Uranus and Pluto, produce instablilty in the character and emotions of the native in all those cases where no harmonious planets(Venus, Jupiter) dominate over the Ascendant.

On the other hand Mars Uranus and Pluto in conjunctions, oppositions or soft aspects (trine, sextile) to the Ascendant, particularly If supported by Venus and (or) kipiter, merely give the native some characteristics of the planet involved. Needless to say, Venus and Jupiter on the Ascendant or Descendant (as well as Sun and Moon mentioned above), if not afflicted by dominating malefics increase the readiness for all kinds of relationship to other persons.

## AADIH COMPARISONS

Experience shows that in most cases where partnership is concemed, it is not the position of both Suns, but any other mutual aspect of radical factors that is much more signif icant.

First, we will deal with the companionship of men and women.
The most significant aspect for analyzing relationships is the conjunction, as in all branches of astrology. The efficacy of conjunctions may be classif ied in the following order :

1. Conjunctions of planets with the Angles of the partner. Usually the orbs of effective confunctions are extremely small. This of course can only be observed in horoscopes with well-authenticated birth times. As can be seen from examples given in Prediction II (British Monarchs) all these conjunctions and, of course, also any other mutual aspects have to be measured on the Ecliptic.
Mundane aspects such as rising and setting are not valid, possibly be-
cause different coordinates of the birth places on not fif together.
2. Mutual conjunctions of Sun and Moon are the best preconditions for any partnership if the conjunction is not heavily afflicted or contradicted by other aspects.
3. Good prospects are further given of the following Ecliptical interchanges:
(a) SUN - VENNS - JUPITER
(b) $M O O N$
(c) MERCUPY -
(d) MARS
(e) PLUTO

While a, b and c are welcomed in ary relationstilp, d and eplay the dominating role in sexual relations.

While Uranus sextile Cusp 11 helped him in his polltical career (support"in politics, propaganda and social welfare by his wife, Evita, and, of course, by friends and some superiors), Neptune afflicting Uranus (quincunx) may have caused his occasional set-backs, (Revolution in 1955 : he had to leave the country). Pluto siquare Node in VII is a general Significator for death. This becomes very obvious when " death ' Is analyzed with Prenatal Transits and Cycles. Besides this, Pluto plays a main role in cancer and in other diseases. Retrospectively, we may assume that this signifles the death of two of his wives by illness (both cancer) during his lifetime.

## BADIX ANALYSIS. EYILA PERON _in relation to Partnershlo (CHARI B)

The Descendant has a trine from Venus; but Moon conjunct Saturn could not possibly have activated partnership. Venus on Cusp 3 (3rd House a domestic politics and propaganda) sextile Mercury, characterizes her active participation In social and polltical affairs. Venus sextile Moon $=$ popularity (she brought Argentine women into public life).
Her early death is symbolized by the square of Sun conjunct Mars to Moon conjunct Satum. Affligtions of this kind from Angular Houses, in an overhelming number of cases, affect health and reduce the bodily resistance against illnesses. Here energy and vitality (Sun conjunct Mars) struggle (square - tension) against lack of resistance (Moon conjunct Saturn) *

Oppositions, although of lesser strength, have about the same character, at least where the demonstrated combinations of the compatible planets are involved ( $1,2,3$ (a) - (e) )
Trines and sextiles of any mutual planetary aspects, whether compatible or incompatible, play a subordinate role in cases where partnership is concerned. These should be neglected unless they are very close (under one degree) and represent dominant radical positions of the factors involved.

In this connection the writer has to mention that textbooks which give hundreds of recipes for all possible mutual planetary interchanges in Radix comparison from conjunctions down to minor aspects are not rellable, because :
a) They are not the result of analyses. Hundreds of delineations need thousands of cases, and how can young authors have had such experlence?
b) Recipes would not work in practice, simply because similar planetary aspects such as, for instance, Sun partner $A$ In square to Mars of partner $B$, may give different results in different relatlonships. Such an aspect of tension may produce positive characteristics in one partnership and negative ones in another. The delineation of Partner-Horoscopes gives true characteristics and permits a fairly good forecast only if the essential factors in partner comparison are used.

## RADIX ANALYSIS in relation to dartnershí Juan D. PERON

The Descendant is in Gemini, a dual sign; this means by tradition that there may be more than one marriage during the llfetime. (Peron was married three times).
Moon within $6^{6}$ of arc on the Descendant, not alflicted and sextile to Jupiter, is a good precondition for a harmonious married life.
Venus on Cusp 11, sextlle Uranus (orb $6^{\circ}$ ) opposite Cusp 5 : generally a good sex life, but the possibility of decelving or being decelved. (Venus square Neptune from VII).

## THE NELU PARTNER - HOROSCOPE*

This method has been tested by the writer with more than 200 examples. It may be regarded as an adequate complement to the traditional comparison of two Radix horoscopes as demonstrated above. As distinct from the usual Radix - Radix interpretation, where the mutual aspects have to be analyzed, the Partner-Horoscope not only allows an evaluation of mutual aspects but also has to be regarded as an independent self-contained Horoscope. Charts of thls kind permit the astrologer to evaluate the output of the partnership.

The Partner-Horoscope is the product of both participants and it always has a lot to show asregards good or poor chances for the future. The analysis of this Horoscope must be performed in a most simple way, examining only the most characteristic indications such as:
a) The positlon of the Luminaries and planets in the Quadrants, whether above or below the Horlzon, whether on the East- or West side of the Horoscope.
b) The Angularity of the Luminarles and planets.
c) The usual analysis of mutual aspects, where, of course, the individual aspects with MC, ASC, SUN and MOON should have priority. The idea of this Chart, which the writer is going to explain, had its origin in the consideration, that the horoscope of the younger partner has to be seen as a transit map with regard to the map of the elder one, l. e. the Partner - Horoscope is a prenatal transit chart which is based on the elder partner as a Radix with birth data of the younger as a transit.

To compute this horoscope we have only to apply the rules and computations demonstrated in ' Prediction using Common and Prenatal Cycles' , pages 2, 9, 10 with Prenatal Transits. Here the computation is identical with the computation of Prenatal Transits, according to the astronomical characteristics of a Partner - Horoscope.

1. The four partnerships of astrologers show that the Partner-Horoscope on its own (without the analysis of mutual aspects) already glves undeniable indications of the qualfty and characteristics of the relationship.
(a) The SUN in all four demonstrated charts is near the MIDHEAVEN. With (b) this indicates activity and success.
(b) QUALITY is shown by favourable planets on the Angles, preferably on the MC.
(c) The CHARACTERISTICS are dIsclosed by approprlate planets for - sclentific collaboration ": SUN, MERCURY, JUPITER, URANUS .
2. The mutual aspects of the two Radices and Radix comparisons with the Partner Horoscope are also mainly favourable planetary combinations.
3. To have a clear Impression when analyzing and judging a relationshlp it is recommended that mainly conjunctions and oppositions (Angular and interplanetary aspects) are used. .

4 The Partner-Horoscope should be computed for the place where both partners first met. Naturally the same applies for people who met only once, such as in road accidents, assassinations, etc. In cases where people never met, the birth place of the elder (f irst choice) and the younger partner have to be considered Birth place coordinates also show some effect in cases where the partners have met In places other than their birth place.
5. Exactness of the kind demonstrated above is only guaranteed if rectifled Radices are used.

A number of characteristically destructive midpoints such as:
MERCURY/SATURN $=$ MARS ; MARS/SATURN $=$ MOON;
MARS/NEPTUNE $=$ SATURN SSATUPNVURAANS $=$ PLUTO
should not be overlooked.

## WHE APPLICATION OF THE TARASIT SYSTEM IN PARTNEH-ROROSCOPES

Analysis has revealed that we do not have to restrict ourselves to this more or less static interpretation of a Partner-Horoscope, for it is also possible to trace events with the ald of common and prenatal transits and cycles for these maps. To illustrate this,_CHARTM shows the prenatal transits for the August 1989 murders, as computed for Partner-Horoscope CHABLK.

The computation is, of course, the very same as that for horoscopes of individuals, and, as explatned above, is identical with the computation of Partner-Horoscopes. The time of the murders on August 9th, 1969, was: 6 h am U.T. on August 10th.

The Grand Cross among the Angular planets SATURN (MC) , PLUTO (ASC), URANUS (IC), MARS (DESC) needs IIttle explanation, for it shows the potertially violent, explosive and fatal consequences which can occur when these planets are in mutual affliction.

VEMUS reaches her position in the Radix (Partner-Horoscope K) within $2^{\circ}$ of arc. The close conjunction of prenatal NEPTUNE to VENUS (ort $20^{\circ}$ ) is therefore intensified many times.

"Besides this, the JuplTER-SATURN conjunction (authority, leadership) is conjunct the Insane MiARS-NEPTUNE conjunction in Mansoris Radix (Chart H).

NEPTUNE and PLUTO play a dectsive role in this Chart, for they form a midpoint with the MC axis (Neptune/Pluto - ICh:

Very effective in the New Partner-Horoscope are also Sidereal Lunar Returns and their Demi's (if the latter's operational date is nearer to the date of the event).

Impressive Lunars of this kind coinclde with events which partners experience together, such as: First meetings, marriages, accidents, law suits, etc. Lunar Returns as auxiliary charts, together with other factors of the Transit System, facllitate forecasting which of the two opponents is going to win the litigation. Further, the outcome of contests in all sorts of competitions such as sporting events and presidential elections may be predicted with these Lunars. For Jimmy Carter and Ronald Reagan see below.

CHART N is a Prenatal Sidereal Lunar Return for the Partner-Horoscope MANSON/ATKINS (Chart K) covering the slaughter of August 9, 1969. Here URANUS (MC), NEPTUNE (DESC) and SATURN (IC) close to an Angle characterize the violence (SATURN, URANUS ; MOON conjunct MARS in opposition to PLUTO) and stealthiness (NEPTUNE) of the event.

CHART O is the corresponding Demi-Lunar for the same Partner-Horoscope and event. Here almost the same Angular planets appear as in the Lunar Retum (Chart N). However, this Chart is more characteristic for the event as MARS is high in the sky on the Midheaven accompanied by SATURN (ASC) and URANUS (DESC), while MOON conjunct PLUTO on the IC completes the affiliction of all four Angles (Grand Cross).

CHABL P, a Prenatal SLR , shows almost the same Ecliptical Angular positlons as its Radix, the Partner-Horoscope MANSON/VAN HOUTEN (Chart L).

VENUS conjunct MARS are on the MC and on the radical VENUS/PLUTO opposition, while URANUS and NEPTUNE form a mundane and Ecliptical square from $X$ to VII. Cardinal Signs (Arles, Cancer, LIbra, Capricorn) reinforce the strength and significance of this Map.

## THE ASCENDANT-LUNAR HOROSCOPE*

This idea originated from the following consideration:
It is possible that the transiting Moon over the radical Ascendant could show a certain efficacy asta Return Chart.

However,miracles had not been expected as many of the auxiliary charts that had been analyzed, such as the Lunar Return derived from the Solar. Return, proved to be too remote.

The only I.unar Retum that seemed to match the common Sidereal Lunar so far had been the Secondary - or NATAL, quotidian-LUNAR derived from the Secondary Progressed (and Regressed) Moon
(The main cycles and their interpretation are explained in the writer's book ' Prediction - Using Common and Prenatal Cveles ').

Misinterpretation and false conclusions can be excluded from workable Lunars if these simple rules are observed:
(a) Consider only those Luminaries and planets that are near the Angles of the chart.
(b) Draw conclusions irom the shape (structure) of the map, i.e. planets above or below the Horizon, accumulations in certain Quadrants, etc.

Supported by experlence, a great number of Ascendant-Lunars have been analyzed, and this method has proved to be valid. Readers should note that precession of the Moon (as in all Sidereal cycles) has to be taken into consideration.

The above illustrates the usual way of calculating these charts. The writer is very doubtil! about the usual handing of this Relationship Chart. The bisection of the coordinates produces places in the world that are rather artificial and which have no connection with any of the partners involved. Experience shows that any astrological chart has to be related either to the birtholace, the place of residence, or the place of the happenings. The writer's analysis of these Relationship Charts, the effectiveness of which seems to be very limited, showed that the place where the two partners first met gives more impressive results. The reader is invited to test the continuous superiority of the New Partner-Horoscope over this Relationship Chart.

Using the approved method of interpretation wherein those planets characterizing the event are close to the Angles of the Lunar Return, we notice that NEPTUNE, the prevlously described planet in the Radix, forms a close conjunction with the MC of our Ascendant-Lunar. The sultable symbolism for our event is.
Drowning of a young woman = NEPTUNE opp. VENUS on IC. The drowning itself is supported by the conjunction of MARS and NEPTUNE.

Neptune's elevation over all the other factors symbolizes the actual mystery of this event, which has apparently never been solved. The incompatiblitty of MARS and NEPTUNE is referred to in the "Partner-Horoscope".
For PRIMARY DIRECTIONS see Ed. Kennedy's Radix (Chart 1) and Directions.
The symbolism of an unusually high number of Directions shows that a great number of the demonstrated Directions reflect the event

This case has naturally caused many doubts but it did not end Kennedy's political career, which, considering the attitude of the public to such incidents, may be regarded as extremely unusual.

Perhaps it is the conjunct ion of MOON and NEPTUNE in Kennedy's Radix in a very close sextile to the MC that may be identified with this event. It was a mysterious affair (Neptune) In which a woman (Moon) was drowned (Neptune). Moon conjunct Neptune is in the 8th House, the House of death. On the other hand, the sextlle of Moon and Neptune to the MC saved Kennedy from being expelled from politics.

Conceming the incident itself, a major role should also be played by the conjunction of VENUS (young woman) with URANUS (unusual event), in the 3rd House, the House of trips and short journeys.

Remarkable in this combination is the very close square of Venus to the Ascendant and consequently to the Descendant (partners). In this connection, it was the close trine of JUPITER to URANUS that inspired Kernedy 'to do the right thing at the right time', l.e. not surrender himself to the police. Incidentally, it seems very likely that Kennedy was completely drunk at the time of the incident (Moon,Neptune). To be honest, we cannot say that the Radix itself points to the " most important man in the State".

However, analyses of horoscopes of U.S. Presidents with rellable birth times revealed that the Radix alone does not show whether a polltician will be.elected President one day or not. In contradistinction to thls are the horoscopes of rulers of states,such as dictators, and especially queens and kings. In the Radices of these, with few exceptions (short reign), planets are to be found in the neighbourhood of the MC.
(See Radices of British Monarchs, Prediction II)

CHABL 4: An Ascendant-Lunar for Kennedy's plane disaster in June 1964 shows three planets appropriate for the event, i.e. SATURN, URANUS and PLUTO on the MC - IC axis.

CHARI 5: shows an Ascendant-Deml-Lunar for the sudden death of Kennedy's sister caused by a plane disaster. Here the three malef ics MARS, SATURN and PLUTO are high in the sky on the MC in a mundane square to the MEAN NODE (Ta!I). The latter indicates an end to the relationship of people by death If, as in our case, aspected by SATURN (mourning) and PLUTO (shock).

CHABI 6 : shows an Ascendant-Deml-Lunar for the death of Kennedy's father whlch occured on November 4, 1969.

The corresponding Ascendant-Lunar, October 17, 1969; IOh O2m U.T. (not reproduced), which elready went into operation 25 days before the event, points out the event with MARS ( 179 Capricom) on IC (149 Capricorn) Much more characteristic for the event is the Ascendant-DemiLunar. MARS is on the MC; SUN opposite SATURN and NEPTUNE have the Ascendant as common midpolnt. SUN ( $70^{\circ} 5 c 020^{\circ}$ ) and SATURN ( 58 Taul $8^{\circ}$ ) both symbolizing the father, are conjunct the radical ASC-DESC axis. As can be seen, Deml-Lunars are always erected on the corresponding Moon's opposition. In our case we have to deal with the position of the radical Descendant plus 31 ' of Precession.

## CONCLUSION:

The described Ascendant-Lunars and Demis may be used as auxiliary charts of considerable efficacy. However, these Lunars are destined to fulfll much more important tasks, once their astronomical and astrological significance becomes fully realized. As we know, the apparent movement of the Moon is one degree in two hours (average), while the Ascendant covers a whole Sịn of the Zodiac ( 30 degrees) In two hours (average). Therefore, in all cases where analyses with Ascendant Lunars of the demonstrated kind produce falrly good results, we can be absolutely sure that we have a well-authenticated birth time as:

Even a difference of 5 of ars in the Ascendant's Longitude alters the Universal Time of an Ascendant Lunar by 10 minutes in time. Accordingly a difference of 15 ' of arc between the true Ascendant and the Ascendant originating from records, changes the U.T. and consequently the RAMC of our Ascendant-Lunar by 30 minutes.


There is no need to point out that a difference of 30 minutes changes the shape of any cyclic chart considerably. In order to confirm our research results, the author has used 15 rectified birth charts and, as the Ascendant-Lunars revealed, with only one railure. That is to say, 14 properly rectified horoscopes, using a considerable number of events, have been confirmed by the above demonstrated Ascendant-Lunars within a few minutes of arc.

In all cases where the Ascendant-Lunars oo not produce characteristic charts for corresponding events, it is possible to experiment with Ascendant positions (Lunars) for earlier or later birth times. This method of rectification does not nęed any trigonometrical knowledge but requires some caution and patience. It is, after the rectification method with Primary Directions, the most reliable method for authenticating birth times within a few minutes of arc (of RAMC).

The Ascendant-Lunar may be compared to a magnifying glass, where the multipiler is 30 to 1 , f.e. one minute of changed birth time corresponds to thirty minutes in the Ascendant-Lunar time (average). This is because the Ascendant moves 15 ' of arc in one minute of time and it takes the Moon 30 minutes in time to travel this_15 of arc. in cases where the true birth time cannot be detected because it is too far out of range for the recommended method, the reader should use common Sidereal Lunar Returns. In this case, one minute of difference in the birth time corresponds to one minute of Lunar time. After a rough rectification with Sidereal Lunars we may continue a more ref ined rectification with Ascendant-Lunars.

The Ascendant Lunar is highly effective in all Radices which represent a normal birth, i.e. where the time period between conception and birth has been 9 months (around 270 days).

The most reliable rectification method, of course, remains the rectification with Topocentric Primary Directions, with a considerable number of events avaliable. (See, Prediction //)

## a New religble method to trace the CONCEPTION - HOROSCOPE

The analysis of the Ascendant-Lunar demonstrated on the Radix of Edward Kennedy showed the application of this Sidereal Lunar Return to achieve well-authenticated birth times. However, going more deeply into this subject, the writer realized that the Ascendant-Lunar perhaps could De the first clue for an identification of the Conception-Horoscope, also calied the Prenalal Lpoch.

Those readers who are acquainted with elements of the Prenatal Transit System perhaps already expect a prenatal equivalent for this AscendantLunar.

Indeed, work on a Prenatal Ascendant-Lunar was simultaneously carried out with the hope of making a,successful approach to the astrological expression and the timing of a Conception-Horoscope.

According to some traditiopal beliefs, the Ecliptical position of the radical Ascendant or Descendaht should correspond to the Ecliptical Moon position of the Conception-Horoscope, i.e. the Prenatal Epoch. On the other hand, the radical position of the Moon should be identical with the Ascendant or Descendant of the Conception-Horoscope. Prior to the autnor's newly-started research upon this matter, all the experiments failed, because the horoscopes with well-authenticated birth times could not be forced to fit into these mutually dependent conditions.

A comparatively simple answer to the question of a Conception-Horoscope, which in the author's opinion had never been solved to full satisfaction, is a PRENATAL SIDEREAL-LUNAR derived from the Ascendant-Lunar. (See previous chapter).

Let us presume that the Moon of the Prenatal Epoch (Conception-Horoscope ) should have the very same Ecliptical position as the radical Ascendant, then we may, if the experiments are successful:
(a) rename the Ascendant-Lunar of the Radix as an ordinary Sidereal Lunar of the Conception-Horoscope ;
(D) be able to find the date and time of the Conception-Horoscope with the aid of the prenatal version of the Ascendant-Lunar (now the ConceptionLunar):
(c) regard the identified Conception-Horoscope as the astronomical and astrological center of both the ordinary Lunar (formerly ASC-Lunar) and its prenatal equivalent, the Prenatal-Lunar.

A great help in all the investigations has been the fact that, with only one detected exception, it was possible to experiment with well-authenticated (rectifled) birth times. This provided a really consolidated starting point. Nelther traditional rules nor modern medical assumptions had been fully taken into consideration, because the search for the ConceptionHoroscope has been carried out by purely astronomical and astrological means. The Prenatal SIdereal Lunar of the Conception-Horoscope, the date and time of which was at first unknown, served as a fundamental idea

This seemed to be a mathematically insoluble problem. However, the following consideration helped to find a solution: The distance between date and time of the Conception-Horoscope and the already known Lunar Return of the Conception-Horoscope (formerly the Ascendant-Lunar) must be almost the same as the distance between the unknown ConceptionHoroscope and the stlll unknown date and time of the Prenatal Lunar of this Conception-Horoscope.

Presuming that the former Ascendant-Lunar of the Radix is in fact the ordinary Lunar of the Conception, we may proceed as follows:

A glance at the Ephemerls shows that the Moon had reached $100 \mathrm{Cap} 51^{\circ}$ or January 16, 1893. Because of the irregular apparent motion of the Moon the true prenatal Lunar date may differ from the computed one by roughly up to three days. in our case we observe a difference of two days.

In this Prenatal Chart we notice an unusually large number of planets on the Angles. According to experience, this indicates that in this Lunar period an event is very likely to happen. The death of father is shown by the closely ascending MARS and the descending SATURN which also has a small orb, while MUPITER, still within the region of the Ascendant, points to an Inheritance and succession.

WE find the same MARS/SATURN opposition assoclated with Jupiter in the prenatal Demi-Lunar which naturally is closer to the event by two weeks (Cnart 6a). The Angularities of MERCURY and VENUS in both Maps (Chart 6a and Chart 6b) could be a further indication for the inheritance and the formalities associated with it.

In the actual Conception-Demi-Lunar (Chart 6) originally reproduced above as Ascendant-Demi-Lunar, the necessary indications for 'Death of father ' , such as the Angularities of SUN, MARS and SATURN are already registered.

For " the entering upon an office ' by Edward Kennedy as a Senator on January 9, 1963, the corresponding Prenatal Conception Lunar is at November 7, 1899 (Chart 7). The characteristic planets for this event are undoubtedly SUN conjunct JUPITER on the Descendant.

The corresponding Prenatal Demi-Lunar shows a conjunction of MARS and JUPITER on the Ascendant (Chart 7a). With thls Map, two weeks nearer to the event, the Cardinal position of JUPITER in the LUNAR (Chart 7) has been verified.

The reader may have noticed that in this chapter only converse, l.e. prenatal charts have been discussed and reproduced. This is because these prenatals are the onlychacts that may be taken as proofs for the properly authenticated Conception-Horoscope (Prenatal Epoch), while AscendantLunars in the previous chapter, here renamed Conception-Lunars support the theory for charts which seem to be appropriate for the events analyzed.

The author's trust and confidence in this theory result from the analysis of a great number of Radices.

Two more events in Edward Kennedy's life are reproduced which should not only show the efficacy of the charts but which help to confirm the validity of the Conception- Horoscope (Chart Ia).

EYENT: Assassinat lon of his brother. JOHN E KENNEDY computed for the place of the happenings, Dallas) (Chart 8).
SATURN on the MC in opposition to pluto rm the IC within a mundane accuracy of $9^{\circ}$ of arc. (RA Saturn $=254^{\circ} 38^{\circ}$; RA Pluto $=74^{\circ} 29^{\circ}$ )

For 'His sister's death in an air crash' ; May 13, 1948, the Prenatal Demi-Lunar of the Conception Horoscope, June 24, 1914, is reproduced (Chart 5a). MARS on IC and SATURN on ASC are in a very close mundane square. (See also the corresponding Demi-Lunar, Chart 5, as explained above].

## THE DURL-TEST * <br> _BY_PBIMARY DIRECTIONS AND IHE CONCEPTION-HOROSCOPE

While Lunar Retums and their Prenatals derived from the radical Ascendant which we renamed as Conception-Lunars, are only imperfect proofs for the usefulness of the Conception-Horoscope, other methods had to be found to give this phenomenon a true, practical and sclentific base. The best way for this, so It seemed, was a test that would show the efficacy of thls Conception-Horoscope in other already proven astrological systems when working on a birth chart. In contradistinction to the Lunars' that we used above for the search of the Conception-Horoscope via characteristic planets on the Angles of the chart, Primary Directions which mature with very small orbs should not only prove the effectiveness of the chart but, what seems to be more important, could give decisive proofs of the precise date and time of the Conception-Horoscope also known as the Prenatal Epoch.

The workings of Primary Directions have been extensively explained in 'Prediction // -Directions and the Art of Rectification '. Here the author will restrict himself to general explanations.

The following Primary Directions have been found to be effective in the Radix and the corresponding Conception-Horoscope :
a) Radix factors plirected to Radix factors
b) - - factors of the Conception-Horoscope
c) Factors of the Conceptlon-Horoscope directed to factors of the

Conception-Horoscope
d) directed to Radical factors.

As on the average the number of possible Directions increases here by four times compared with our usual Radix analysis, the greatest care must be taken concerning a rectified Radix and Conception-Horoscope, small orbs of the Directions, and the true symbolism of Luminaries, planets, Angles and House Cusps.

As in the analysis of V.I.P.'s the near circumstances of the available events are not always known, we have to restrict ourselves to the most effective and characteristic Directions.

Here, as in many other Radices analyzed, MARS plays a main role by his pure symbolism. The 12th Cusp expresses perhaps a confinement to the barracks for a certain time.

## 5. MABRIAGE

These characteristic Directions with the Significators ASC and DESC, combined with: MOON, VENUS and UPITER, do not need any explanations.

6 SHAKEN IN DEBAIE
MERCURY and the 3rd Cusp symbolize the debate, while MC d square NEPTUNE may have involved some sort of misunderstanding or confusion.

## 7. HIS BROTHER 」 E, KENNEDY ASSASSINATED

The DESCENDING NODE represents here ' separation from a relative or friend by death. Very significant are the Secondary Directions with the 3rd Cusp symbolizing the brother.

## 8. PLANE CRASH

The accident itself is symbolized by URAMUS d conjunct MERCURY and ASC d quincunx PLUTO. SATURN e square DESCENDING NODE could be characteristic for the death of a relative or friend involved in the same accident, circumstances of the plane crash the writer does not know.

## 9. BROTHEB ASSASSINATED

As in the similar event No. 7 the NODE appears this time with NEPTUNE (ambush,conspiracy).

## 10. YOUNG WOMAN DROWNED

This event which was noticed world-wide has been explained in connection with the Birth Chart and Lunar Returns. It is backed up by a considerable number of characteristic and poweriul radical Directions. The DESCENDING NODE Indicates death (of a relative or friend) while reached by the converse radical MC. Sudden death by accident Is covered by Vill d opposite URANUS.

I remind the reader that in Primary Directions the Bth Cusp is a Significator of death for the people in the native's surroundings, but never for the death of the native himself.

The reader will notice that five of Edward Kennedy's main events have already been demonstrated in various Conception-Lunars which however in the first instance express the main psychological experiences of the native during the time period of the cycle in question, and should not be combined with the interpretation of Directions.

Pain is also expressed in ASC direct (Epoch) sextlie SATURN rad Expërlence has shown that malefics (MARS, SATURN, NEPTLNE, PLUTO), if directed, in harmonious aspects to other radical factors do not necessarily produce positive, i.e. agreeable events. Of course, this sextlle obviously also expresses that the operation had been successful and probably without any complications.

URANUS c conjunct VENUS points to "Tonsils ' by two radical and conceptional indications:
Radix aspect : VENUS conjunct URANUS (Chart I)
Epoch aspect: VENUS near an Angle, in Taurus, the Sign symbolizing thic neck. (Chart | a)

## 2. BROTHER DIED IN A PL ANE CRASH

Here the three Directions with PLUTO are most characteristic. Although the 3rd House Direction with VENUS in III (brothers, sisters) would suit the traditional rules of interpretation, the efficacy of a female planet in this connection seems to be doubtful.

As can be seen on the list, PLUTO is involved in most of the deaths of Edward Kennedy's relatives.

## 3. SISIER DIED

Beside PLUTO (two squares with the IC) VIII d opposite MOON is very characteristic for the event.

As both charts are very characteristic for the event it is impossible to make a reliable choice for the position of the Moon in the wanted Concep-tion-HorosZope, l.e. whether the ASC or the DESC of the Radix (Chart A) should be the Zodiacal point of the Moon In the Conception-Horoscope.

On the other hand the reader might have noticed that MOON Radix = 69 Gemini $54^{\circ}$ is very close to the rectifled radical Descendant 62 Gemini $48^{\circ}$. For this reason in this Radix the common Sidereal-Lunar for the radical Moon will always give similar results to the Lunar erected on the Tropical(precessed) position of the radical Descendant. The only way in this exceptional case is alsearch for the not-yet-known date and time of the Conception-Horoscope by means of prenatal Conception-Lunars.

At first we try to find the date of a possible conception.
Date Radix October 8, 1895, plus 3 months minus 1 year $=$ January 8, 1895. We notice that the Moon reaches the radical Descendant exactly on this date. The distance between both dates consists of 273 days which corresponds to the average time that passes between the conception and the birth under normal conditions.

In this case we have good reason to assume that we have found the wanted date for the Conception-Horoscope.

The assumed provisional date and time for the Conception-Horoscope gives: January 8, 1895 ; 7h 34 m U.T., RAMC $=162^{\circ} 01^{\circ}$ (Birth coordinates, assuming that the place for conception and birth were identical).

We have now the possibility to check this date with the aid of Prenatal Conception- Lunars, or to risk a rectification. The writer recommends that the date is first confirmed or rejected with a number of Prenatal Concep-tion-Lunars. (Thls especially in cases, where no micro-processor is available).

## 11. EATHERDIED

Here MC d square PLUTO is the most impressive Direction for the event. Traditional Astrology would associate PLUTO with a rulership of the radical MC in Scorpio(death ).

As in Radical and Directional interpretations, the traditional rulership of planets only occasionally fits the situation, the writer always first considers the true symbolism of the planets and the Houses as Significators. On the other hand it is obvious that the traditional rulership of planets, giving each planet two Signs of the Zodiac, is not justifled since three more planets have been found.

JUPITER square ASC, although a very powerful Direction, cannot be directly associated with the death of Ed. Kennedy's father. It may concem some difficulties in matters of an inheritance, which here might have been reflected by PLUTO c sextile JUPITER. (Jupiter/Pluto combinations are typical for inheritances and successions).
12. ELECTED SENATOR

The 3rd Cusp is the true Significator for elections; supported by favourable Directions with: MC, SUN, MERCURY, MOON, JUPITER and URANUS.

The reader will observe that in many cases where Directed radical factors had been compared with radical positions of the Conception-Horoscope and vice versa, the orbs exceed the usual limit although the appropriate symbolism for the event analyzed cannot be denied. Astronomical reasons for this difference are under observation. To put these 'outsiders on correct mathematical and astronomical grounds needs some more research Into this matter.

The writer advises the reader to start the DUAL-TEST with the Radix and the Conception-Horoscope on their own charts and on the Radices of their relatives and friends. Subsequent observation of major and minor events and their circumstances help to classify the corresponding Directions.

The writer reminds the reader that for the interpretation of all kinds of Lunars, only planets close to the Angles are characteristic for an event or the psychological experience of the native during the fime period in question. Sometimes Ecliptical squares to these Angular planets with orbs under two degrees may be of some importance. Lunar planets in aspects to radical factors are In general Inconsequent lal. Here the transits of the day of the event and the corresponding prenatal transit-day should be observed more closely.

Very characteristic for a conception with MOON in 6 Geminl are the Descendant-Lunars (Conception-Lunars) for Peron's death. July I, 1974.

Experience shows that in cases of Illnesses and death the converse (prenatal) charts are usually more characteristic for the event.

## SUPPLEMERT

While the manuscript of this book was waiting to be printed, the writer succeeded in finding some more partlculars and rules about the workings of the Prenatal Epoch that should facilitate search and analysis.

1. in order to perform the DUAL-TEST a rectified birth chart is indispensible.
2. The general rule has to be observed : namely, the $M O O N$ is elther waxing In both the birth and Epoch maps, or else waning in both maps. (Exceptions to this rule occur only when the birth is premature, artificially induced, or performed surgically: thus Queen Elizabeth, born by caesarian section, has a waxing Moon in her Radix but a waning one at conception).
3. In most cases the Zodiacal longltude of the radical Ascendant or Descendant is almost Idendical with the longitude of the Conception Moon.

3(o). The almost perfect congruency of radical Ascendant-Descendant and Conception Moon is obviously related to the critical location of the radical Ascendant which, despite an exact RAMC rectification, depends also on the exactness of the birthplace coordinates.
3(b). Experience shows that by paying regard to the rules 1 to 3 a , in most cases, the final rectification of the Conception-Horoscope does not cause any difficulties as its directed factors (to the Conception-Horoscope and to the Radix) produce sufficlent Directions for a secure rectification. Limited to the position of the Moon (radical ASC or DESC), the speculative time for the conception is much closer to the true one than the usually avallable unrectified time of birth.

## 3(c). Esceptions:

In very few cases (up to the present day only three out of 52) the difference between the position of the radical Ascendant (or Descendant) and the Conception Moon may reach and even exceed one degree. Here the writer recommends proceeding as follows:
If rule 3 seems not to work, it is necessary to make an analysis with the Conception-Lunar described in this book.
These exceptions obviously result from some irregularities which are connected with the actual birth process.

About thirty events (eight of which were common to the twins) analyzed In the horoscopes of both twins brought the proof that in this special case the Ecliptical, radical Midheaven position of the twin bom first proved to be the wanted Moon position for the Conception which, of course, these Identical twins had In common.
Another peculiarlty of these Nativities was an eight months time period between conception and birth which in the case of identical twins is not unusual.

## Summarized features of this analysls:

1. The identical twins were born with a time difference of two hours.
2. We had to deal with eight months" babies.
3. Conception and birth happened at different locallties.
4. The MC of the elder twin was the base for computing the Conception Horoscope. (MC $t w i n 1=$ Moon of Conception).

The outcome of the amplysis for 1-4 corresponds to the witness of the mother as well as to the historically provable date, the liberation of Riga on May 22,1919.
This analysis may be a link for further investigations into the lives of identical twins. Charts and events in the life of these will be demonstrated in a U.S. astrological journal.
4. The starting point for the conception should be what we may call the Melve Epach Day.
This date corresponds to a radical Moon position nine months before birth.
5. The general rule which, with amendments, has been adopted from ancient astrologers, and which states that the duration of pregnancy is shorter if the Moon in the birth chart is above the horizon and longer if the Moon in the birth chart is below the horizon has not been found reliable. Although this rule does produce results that are statistically significant, its frequency of being correct falls too short for it to be considered as a general rule.
6. The rule that the Ascendant or Descendant of the Conception Horoscope should correspond to the radical Moon is not valid. Moreover, It is illogical to expect a mutual congruency between the Ascendant or Descendant and the Moon in both the birth chart and the Conception Horoscope.

## 7. Sevem month's babies:

Here reduced to seven months, possibly the same rules have to be applied as in normal cases. So far only one reliable (secure) case has been successfully analyzed.

## Q Itreatical twins:

The following particular case has shed much light on astrological reseanch of twins.

- About 10 years ago the writer succeeded in rectifying the birth charts of identical twins who where born with a time difference of two hours. However, in spite of several efforts during this long period of 10 years, it seemed to be impossible to find the conception date and time which these identical twins should have in common This in spite of the fact that the day of conception was undoubtedly known'. The father of these twins stayed only one day in his home while fighting agalnst the Soviets when liberating RIGA on May 22, 1919). In the mean time a great number of scientifically correct and provable Epoch identifications have been produced by the writer, validating the above demonstrated cognitions.


## An inthoduction into the workings OF FIXED STARS

The following research results are based on over 120 rectified blrth charts of which about 70 are the horoscopes of V.I.P's. and 50 of relatives, frlends and cllents.

The controversial treatment of flxed stars by the ancients as well as in the middle ages and In our'time made it quite difficult to ind a solid base and a real starting point. Nevertheless, It must be admitted that a lot of truth can be found in the traditional interpretation and evaluation of fixed stars. Here mainly the research during the bloom of Arablan culture seems to be essential for the names of the fixed stars and their characteristics.

However, modem astrological research should be free of magic, superstition and other Neptunian analogles. From this point of view, as confirmed by analysis, the nature of fixed stars should nelther be connected with the name of their constellations nor with the name of Zodiacal Signs whether applied in the Trqpical or Sidereal measurement.
According to tradition, SIRIUS, a bright star of the Ist order, is correctly classif led as benevolent. In contrast with this traditional statement, Sirius is also said to be effective in dog bltes or assaults of wild animals,merely because it is located in the constellation of the GREATER DOG. There are many examples of this kind which contradict the actual nature of the star in question.

A second problem which seems not to have been solved is the true symiolism of any fixed star. Here we find contradictory interpretations throughout the whole star catalogue.

I hesitated a long time before I decided that pixed stars should have an Individual significance which in its pure form can only be traced if their dominant position Is an Angle and no other factors (Luminaries or planets) are involved. For this reasont have classif led fixed stars only as:
a) BENEFIC
b) MALEFIC or c) NEUTRAL

1 fully agree that fixed stars may shape the destiny of Individuals as well as the destimy of countries and states. No wonder that individuals who have decisively influenced mankind's history in politics, science or the arts show more influence from ilxed stars than ordinary persons.

## MUNGANE CONJUNCTIONS OF FIHED STARS IN RADICES OF INDIUIDUALS

Much more effective than fixed-star conjunctions in longitude are their conjunctions in RA, OA and OD with the Angles of the Radix and to a certain extent also with the Angles transposed to permanent places of residence.
It is quite evident that the Transit and Prenatal Transit Systems as well as the traditional Directional Systems (Prediction II) follow the Tropical measurement to the full extent. This is quite logical as the Tropical measurement is directly associated with the Ecliptic, the base of our planetary system. However, it cannot be denied that the fixed Heaven with its fixed stars in the constellations is superimposed on our Solar System.

The high efficacy of Sidereal Solar and Lunar Returns is to be found in the confunctions of Luminaries and planets to the Angles of the chart. These conjunctions are only truly significant if they are computed in a mundane manner, i.e. In RA on MC and TC, and in OA (OD) to the Ascendant (Descendant). We have to realize that these conjunctions are completely dissoclated from the Ecliptic. This dissociation sults fixed stars best as they belong to the superimposed Heaven and, besides this, in most cases have a very high latitude, i.e. a very remote position from the Ecliptic.

For the following examples, most of which are taken again from rectifled radices published in Prediction II, I used only the most prominent fixed stars - twenty for RAMC conjunctions and oppositions (conj. RAIC) and fourteen for risings and settings. Six of the twenty prominent fixed stars neither rise nor set at moderate northem and southern latitudes. For computation see Tables B and C and the directions for their use.

Besides this they characterize people who became famous or infamous. For instance, ALGOL with good reason, is sald to be one of the most destructive, dangerous and fatal stars.
ALGOL conjunct MC or ASC has been found in horoscopes of many murderers, mainly sex maniacs.
ALGOL conjunct MC shows the death of the gifted astrologer KAPL ERNST KRAFEI. In a concentration camp.

IVAR KREUGER, once a man of immense fame and wealth, committed suicide after he was rulned due to his own lllegal acts in stock exchange matters. ALGOL was conjunct IC while ALDEBARAN was conjunct MARS in his Radix horoscope.

NLGOL conjunct SUN can be found in the Chart of the well-known astrologer ELSBETH EBERTIN, who perished in a bombing raid

As we will see later, Algol is also frequently Involved in events where obviously the planet to which it is conjoined gives the answer for the kind of happenings. This also concerns all kinds of incurable illnesses.

In view of these examples shown with Algol and also, of course, with other frequently appearing fixed stars of the Ist order, it seems quite $10^{-}$ gical that the classification of stars into a) benefic b) malefic and c) neutral gives a better starting point in this field of research than the frequently contradictory combined symbolism (of several planets) of traditional astrology.

To give the reader the possibility to analyze the examples given in this chapter, I have used most of the rectified charts(numbers in brackets) published in Prediction //.

The above analysis of 20 nativities and the Radix of West Berlin produced an overwhelming number of prominent fixed stars (*** and **) in conjunction with radical factors.

Here are the frequencies and proportions of the classified stars :

55 fixed-star conjunctions in 21 horoscopes.
Of these 55 conjunctions, 45 involve prominent fixed stars (*** and **) which, as Table A shows, are only 22 in number.
Besides this we have only 10 conjunctions with other main fixed stars (* and unclassifled ones). These outnumber the prominent ones by " $28: 22$. This is obviously a proof for the high frequency of the prominent stars.

Fixed stars have the same effectiveness in mundane astrology as in the demonstrated horoscopes of V.I.P.'s. Unfortunately only very few horoscopes of states exist that have satisfactory authent cated Firth times. An example is the rectified horoscope of WEST BERLIN.

According to U.S. flles, West Berlin was handed over to United States authorities by the Russians on July 12, 1945, at 6 h U.T. The writer, who used to live in Berlin untll 1955, has carefully recorded the dates of all the eventful years and produced a reliable rectification which gave:
5n 57m 59s U.T., published in the ' sixtles ' in German and English journals.

As in most rectified horoscopes of V.I.P.'s (individuals), the:Radix of West Berlin (Chart BLN) shows a remarkable number of effertive prominent fixed stars which have no doubt supported the City in a most benefic manner. A glance at the Horoscope shows many afflictions such as: MARS (Taurus, detriment) in close square to the Ascendant and the MOON While JUPITER in Virgo and at a weak point of the Chart, l.e. in the middle of the 2nd House, is not of much help elther. These main characteristics and the permanent threat of Soviet Russia encouraged astrologers to predict a very short life for West Berlin.

However, they all have been mistaken. Especially in the horoscopes of states and politicians, the presence of prominent fixed stars in conjunction mainly with Angles, Sun and Moon produce Fate in the pure sense. The Radlx of West Berlin Is one of the examples where benevolent flxed stars have activated this critical but extrovert and vital Chart. (All planets on the East side of the Horoscope).

It has been found that the effectiveness of these brilliant stars of Ist magnitude does not depend on their relation to the Ecliptic, as those with nigh latitudes are of the same efficacy as stars near the Ecliptic. It appears to be different with the main stars of 3rd magnitude. Here stars with almost no latitude, i.e. on the Ecllotic, appear more frequently and with much stronger effect than those whose positions are very remote from the Tropical Zodiac (Ecllptic).

## HOW EHACT MUST WE 日E ?

The rectification of a birth chart has always been a major problem for serious astrologers. . Published horoscopes in today's textbooks and journals clearly indicate that: no general progress has been achieved in this matter, with very few exceptions.

These failures have two main causes:

## 1. Fictional astrologlcal methods have been used. (See chapter above)

2. Coincidence, probably the most important factor in the development of astrological research, has itself become the main obstacle against improved methods of rectification.

In chemistry, physics and most other sclences provable results may be achleved with impressiye experiments and public demonstrations. Things are, however, very different in astrology. Only statistical proofs which demonstrate the high probability of a meaningful astrological coincidence occuning (the appropriate event colnciding with the appropriate astrologlcal predicting factor) are valld if we are to prove the effectiveness of astrology and obtain for it the recognition it so richly deserves. We have to be able to demonstrate that the results we obtain could not have occured simply by chance.

In all applications of astrology that are based on solld astronomical grounds, it is strongly recommended that calculations should be made correct to a minute of arc and a second in time. Whole degrees and whole minutes in time should, of course, be used for simplifled cycle calculations, and for those charts for which the birth time has not yet been fully authenticated. These exceptions apart, the rectifying astrologer's calculattions should necessarlly be as accurate and as tight as is possible.

Let us see why such exact measurement Is necessary.
Although the full circle of the Zodiac contains 21.600 minutes of arc ( $360^{\circ} \times 60^{\circ}$ ), astrologers are irequently tempted to overload this area with far too many Ecliptic points. Those who use combinations of three planets such as 'Sun + Mars - Uranus', are the main culprits.

A simple test with the orbs of aspects produced by Primary Directions and applied to the Radix will demonstrate just how fast the seemingly large area of 21.600 arc minutes can be exhausted and how soon meaningful coincidence becomes indistinguishable from simple chance.

## PLANETS AND CUSPS DIAECTED TB mabICGL FIMED STARS

The predictional value of these fixed-star conjunctions in the Primary Directional system is limited, because they can only be regarded as a support of characteristlc angular and planetary Directions. Nevertheless careful analyses of these frequently appearing fixed-star Directions, helped to establish their character, importance and frequency. Here, as the result of precise radical figures, a maximum orb of 1 ' of arc is found to be valid. Due mainly to inaccuracies of the coordinates and some times of the reclified RAMC, the orb may be extended to $3^{\prime \prime}$ of arc.

In view of their frequency and efficacy, and to limit the number of fictions, only prominent fixed stars of the first and second order(*** and **) should be used I advise the reader to use only direct and converse radical factors to Ecliptical positions of the fixed stars. Here too only conjunctions are effective. The Directing of flxed stars to radićal factors (Speculum: OA; OD; Pole) is still a matter of careful research. The writer achieved some good results in his own Radix and in the Radices of relatives and iriends, when directing prominent pixed stars to other radical factors in the Primary Directional system. Successful research in this subject presupposes the accurate recording of events.

In general, true Directions, using the correct symbolism of the astrological factors involved, should not exceed an orb of four minutes of arc. The theoretical orb is 2.5 of arc (See Prediction II). In practice, depending on the appropriateness of the factors Involved and the exactness of the coordinates, the aspectual orbs may become larger.

The maximum admissible orb of up to 4 of arc, in theory and practice, results in an armissible average orb of two minutes of are

Needless to say, for the experienced astrologer the odds against chance colncidence are substaņtially increased if the accepted Directions are limited solely to those planets and House cusps whose symbolism fits the specific event.

A correct statistical test of the validity of Primary Directions can only be performed by a skillful and experienced statistician, taking into consideration all appearing directions without paying regard to the character of the event and to the appropriate symbolism of the planets. (Accumulations of Directions - odds against chance).

As the proportlonal division of the 21.600 of arc clearly shows, the introduction of additional factors into any Directional system will diminish any chance of obtaining valid results.

In recent years I have met a few astrologers who, although not quite mastering the subject, are on the right way to become experienced astrologers in this field. On the other hand, as my subsequent checking clearly showed, I met others who obtained incorrect results throughout.
Invariably the reason for these fallures was not the use of too large an orb for the Directions, but was either:

1. A too generous application of symbolism to planets, Angles or House Cusps ; or
2. too extended application of aspects: using such as 150 , 750. 1050 and 165 o aspects, Directing House cusps to aspects with other(radical) House Cusps, etc.
3. The most frequent error however was the fact that these unexperienced astrologers did not realize that Angular and cusp Directions should reflect the events in an adequate proportion(sufficient in number). This latter is an undoubted proof for any rectification with Primary Directions in the Topocentric System, provided that a sufficient number of events is available.

When we consider an aspect by Direction, we must recognize the possibility of it occurring from either of two directions, clockwise or anticlockwise, hence the basic factor for our analysis of aspectual orbs shrinks from 21.600 to 10.800 of arc (21.600/2). We can therefore say that the Direction of one planet to its conjunction with a single radical planet, within an orb of 1 ' of arc, has a theoretical coincidence factor of:
T/10800 In other words, where there just one radica: and only one directed factor existing in the Zodiac, an event that coincided with such a tight conjunction of these two bodies would provide odds of 10800 to 1 in our favour that the coincidence was not just a chance happening.

Such odds may seem quite encouraging to the researcher, but let us now apply this theoretical probability to the real world in which we gperate. As the following proportions clearly show, in reality the coincidence factor with which we actually must work diminishes far too quickly.


Now let us also take the sixteen traditional aspects into consideration: the conjunction and opposition, two squares, two trines, two sextiles, two semisquares, two sesquiquadrates, two semisextiles and the two quincunx'.

These sixteen aspect points further reduce our coincidence factor down to $108 / 16$ or 6,75 to 1. Expressed differently, if one directs ten bodies to ten natal bodies and uses the sixteen above stated aspects, there is likely to result at least one exact direstional aspect within an orb of 6.75 minutes of arc, simply due to chance alone. If we include the converse Directions this figure will even be reduced to $3.4^{\prime}$. of $\operatorname{arc}(6.75 / 2$ ).
Apply the same logic for the twelve house cusps directed to the ten natal plapets. The coincidence factor is 7.5 to one, converses included even 3.8 to one ( 7.5 / 2). Naturally we obtain the same result if, vice versa, we direct the ten planets to the twelve radical House cusps.

The coincidence factors given above are necessarily approximations. We do not usually direct a planet to its own position, e.g. Mars to Mars. But on the other hand we have not taken the Part of Fortune and the Mean Lunar Node into consideration, and both of these points are extremely important factors in the Radix and in Directions.

The use of individualistic points such as MC and ASC with small orbs is not impressive either, as so far I have not found any Radices which had been satisfactorily rectified. (This is in Uranian textbooks and journals).
b) The computer showed that the accumulations of structures in Radices cannot be properly controlled as they are continuously overlapping.

An error in logle also appears when we notice that Uranian astrologers concentrate only on those combinations which they happen to need for the characteristics of the event. What happens with the other 5000 combinations at any time in any Radix for any event?
In contrast with this the reader is reminded that in traditional astrology, for logical reasons, we examine all traditional aspects to the Radix that appear in transits as well as in Directions.

The writer also noticed a great deal of false symbolism in one of the leading textbooks on Uranian Astrology. -'Regelwerk für Planetenbllder' = ' Rules for Planetary Structures
It takes too much space to enumerate all the wrong symbolism and other obviously fictional assumptions in this book: Here is one example:
MOON plus MARS is symbolized as:

- The workings of the brain; the beloved woman; the energetic woman; working hours '.

However, my criticism is not, as it seems, only against the Uranian System. The same abuse and misuse of astrological factors also appears in other systems. Here the abuse of midpoints dominates. Traditional methods, if not handled properiy, give no better results either, as wrong application of astrological symbolism frequently occurs.

The fundamental problem in astrology (the real starting point) has been solved in theory and practice by RECTIFICATION, but it lacks a sufficient number of talented and experienced astrologers.

## FICTIONS IN ASTROLOGY

The Directional systems which follow have been analyzed by the writer in the seventles with the ald of a large 1 BM computer. About 200 events have been computed with thousands of midpoints and triple combinations. This was done with much generosity towards orbs and symbolism of the planets.

The following may be regarded as fictions in Astrology:

1. The Solar-arc in the Ecliptic, also called the Symbolic Arc

2 The Uranian System using nypothetical Trans-Neptunian points on or near the Ecliptic, in connection with No. 1 and also in the Transit System.
3.The excessive, uncontrolled use of midpoints in Directions and transits.

The methods in No. 2 vary silghtly, however, about 5430 triple combinations were noticed, which, If used only in conjunctions, give the following proportions on the zodiac:
$360 \times 60=21600^{\circ}$ of arc, divided by $5430=4^{\prime}$ approximately, ie. there are 5430 points on the Zodiac (whole circle) with ords of plus/minus 2 of arc (average).

These figures may be extended 'ad absurdum • if this technique is rearced to a $90-$, 45 - or 22.5 wheel measurement.

No wonder that whatever technique is applled, up to 15 and more midpoint combinations can be produced at any time for any event in any Radix with ' small orts ' and a more or less sat isfying symbolism.

Followers of this Uranlan System maintain that their results are controlled by so-called planetary structures whicn, as they claim, appear in the Radix as accumulations. The writer has analyzed these planetary structures (accumulations) and found that they are:
a) Not individualistic, as in the overwheiming number of cases, they are connected with elther slow planets or even much more slowly moving hypothetical points which are almost the same in the Radices of individuals born within time perlods or days up to months.

Considering the amount of fictional productions in astrology found in textbooks, articles in Journals and teachings of inexperienced astrologers, compared with the relatively small number of talented and experienced astrologers, there might be a long way for astrology to go before it is recognized and established the way it was centuries ago (this in relation to the general developmentlof sciences in those times and nowadays). There is no doubt that astrology can be brought to perfection in the same way as has happened to other branches of sclence.
Further developments in astrology might also one day start to decisively influence phllosophy and also religion. Other matters which are still consldered as magle, bellef, etc., may one day be acknowledged or re jected by modern observat ion methods and stat istics.
The writer is sure that all those things that are still unknown, will one day be successfully analyzed. This is not a matter of fantasy or belief but corresponds to the fantastic and (centuries ago) unforeseen development of all sciences, many of which had been brought to the utmost degree of perfection humanly possible. For such a development of astrology to occur, however, we need more people who have a scientific mind, do not regard astrology as a belief system, and show perseverance and a realistic approach to the matter.
THOMAS A. EDISON, one of the greatest inventors of our times who was once asked how he managed to invent hundreds of things with, as it seemed, little effort, answered: ' You are mistaken, all my inventions are based on 99 per cent perspiration and I per cent inspiration.

## CONCLUDING REMRBKS

Advanced research in astrology demonstrated in Prediction II and in this book, has undoubtedly revealed that astrology practised in a serlous and reasonable way is based on sclentific grounds. Astrological efficacy, as appearing in Topocentric Primary Directions and in the Meridian Distances measured in Obllque Ascension and Descension (also used as Ascensional Transits), is apparent enough to de statistically evaluated.

The writer, has studied the main principles of statistics and found that, although a more simplified statistical application gives very Impressive results, a faultless statistical demonstration needs a fully-qualifled statistician with much experience. That is to say, even very skiliful statistical analyses have aroused criticism and rejection. This because of unimportant errors which do not change the actual result of the analysis.

Besides such a statistical approach to matters of astrology, it is also necessary to have a neutral board of sclentists, who may give the expertenced astrologer certaln tasks and problems to be solved.
One of the acid proofs for the full sclentific value of an approved astrological system are MDO's (Prediction II). These prove that in an overwhelming number or cases, relatives in direct IIne ( grand-parents, parents, children ) have identical Meridian Distances in OA and OD, the latter appearing mostly in conjunctions and to a lesser extent in oppositions and Antiscions.

In Prediction II a list shows that all Engllsh Monarchs from Queen VIctoria cont inwously to Queen Ellzabeth II have these identical MDO's in their Radices.
Needless to say, these Horoscopes have been properly rectifled as the demonstrated events and Directions show.

The same scientific valldity can also be found in Ascensional Iransits and Primary Directions (Prediction II), particularly in the DUAL-TEST (Primary DIrectlons of the Radix and the Prenatal Epoch(Conception-Horoscope)described in this book). Here again I remind the reader of those mostly non-astronomical systems which ignore the natural rules of colncldence and which, in practice, achieve just an opposite, l.e. more or less meaningless results which will fit in any existing or non-existing birth chart for any event and any date. (See under ' Fictions in Astrology ' in this DOOK).

By experience a maximal ort of I year $=50^{\circ}$ is suggested. However, in practice due to imperfect planetary positions, larger orbs may be admitted. It is recommended that Astronomical Ephemerides or computer-precislon programs are used.

## RULE A (example above)

In cases where the planet has a greater radical position than the ilxed star, the maturation of their conjunction is produced by the precessed position of the flxed star.

RULE_B (example below)
in cases where the planet has a lesser radical position than the fixed star, the maturation of their conjunction is produced by precession of the planet.

As for the computation of RAMC (RAIC), TABLE C merely has the task of detecting ascending or descending fixed stars in the horoscopes analyzed. In these tables all values have been referred to the RAMC.

EXAMPLE: In Table C 1950 (January 1) SPICA (33) is rising at \(7 \mathrm{n} 48 \mathrm{~m} 05 \mathrm{~s}(30 \mathrm{~N} . \mathrm{L})=.1178 \mathrm{Ol} \mathrm{in} \mathrm{arc}\).
in fact the actual rising took place at \(117801^{\prime}+902=207801\). In other words, the RAMC of a Radix is valid for all figures in the Tables without adding \(90^{\circ}\) for risings and deducting 908 for settings. This should not be forgotten when, as in the following examples, rising and setting is computed with the aid of Table B.

Ascandent-L uner Hor ascoper. A horoscope calculoted for the moment when the Moon irensits the ASC of the Radix. (See under 'Concoption Luner')

Conception-L uner Horoscupe: A horoscope calculated for the moment when the Moon tronsits the Moon of the Cunception Hor cscape. (Prenotel Epoch)

Cunception-Demi-L uner Her esceppe: A haroscape calculated for the mament when the Moon of the Conception Horoscope is transiting its apposite Ecliptic point. (Prendal Epoch)

Descendent-i uner-Horsecope: A horwscope calculated for the moment when the Moon trenstis the Descendent of the Retix. (See under 'Conception Luner ')

Deal-Ase( Desc)-Luarer : A horoscope calculoted for the moment when the Moon trensits etther the apposite Ecliplic point of the ASC = DESC ( a ) or DESC = ASC ( D )
This aspends on whether the ASC or the DESC of the Radix car responds to the Moon of the Prenatal Epoch (Conception Horoscope).

MDO : The Mer Idien Distence of a bool divided by its Seml Arc and mulliplied by 90 degrees

Matal Quotidien-Luner: A Lunar Raturn Chart based on the position of the Moon In the Secondery Progressed or Regressed Birth Mapl See' Prealcilon Using Common and Prenolal Cycles' . pege 47)

Mow-Periner-Horoscope: A composite haroscape of Iwo people in which the IIme elepsed from the birth of the elder to the birth of the youngar is deacted from the birth of the elder, and the Cherl is computed for the prenatal dote and time thus found

Pertner-Hor oscope : See under Naw-Partner-Horcoscope
Prenatol-Transit Systom : Iransits before birth which result from the deduction from the Redix of the time (in deys,hours,minutes and seconds) past between the Redix and the Transit. (See' Prediciton Using Common and Pranalal Cycles ')

Prenatal Cycles: All kinds of Cycles which are based on the same esiranomical principles os the Prenatal Iransils (See, Prenalai-Iransit-Syslem)

Primery Directions: Directions based on the exial rotation of the Earin as distinct from Progressions in the Zodioc due to the orbital motion of the pianels.

Sidersal-Soler( or Lunar) Return: A Return Chert errected in the Iroploal Zodisc but with the position of the Sun( orMoon) moved forwerd in the Zodlac by the emount of Precession since the date of the Redix.

Topacantric thouse Division: The discovery of V. Polich and Helson Page. The Poles of the House Cusps are sildtity different from those derived by the Placidian method.

Topocentric Prieary Directions: The special method of Primary Directing developed by Yendei Poiltch and A. P. Neison Page in Argentino during the \(1960^{\circ}\) s. Features distinguishing the Topocentric from other systems of Primary Directing are the different formulas for calculating the Pole of the so-callad Sipnificstor and its Ascensional Difference under that Pole. The time measure is the Meon Soler Arc in Right Ascension ( the " Nsibod Anc \({ }^{\circ}\) ) \(=0^{\circ} 59^{\prime \prime} 8.33^{\prime \prime}\) per yoor.
